Global Performance Outlook

According to UNWTO World Tourism Barometer of December 2020, international tourist arrivals (overnight visitors) globally were expected to decline by between 70% and 75% in 2020 in comparison to 2019. This takes us back to the arrivals levels of 30 years ago. The decline in the first ten months of the year represented 900 million fewer international tourist arrivals compared to the same period in 2019, and translates into a loss of US\$ 935 billion in export revenues from international tourism, more than 10 times the loss in 2009 under the impact of the global economic crisis. <u>UNWTO December Barometer</u>. The Barometer further projected a total loss for the year of US\$1.1 trillion in international tourism receipts. This is a 74.3% decline as worked out against the US\$1.48 trillion realized in 2019.

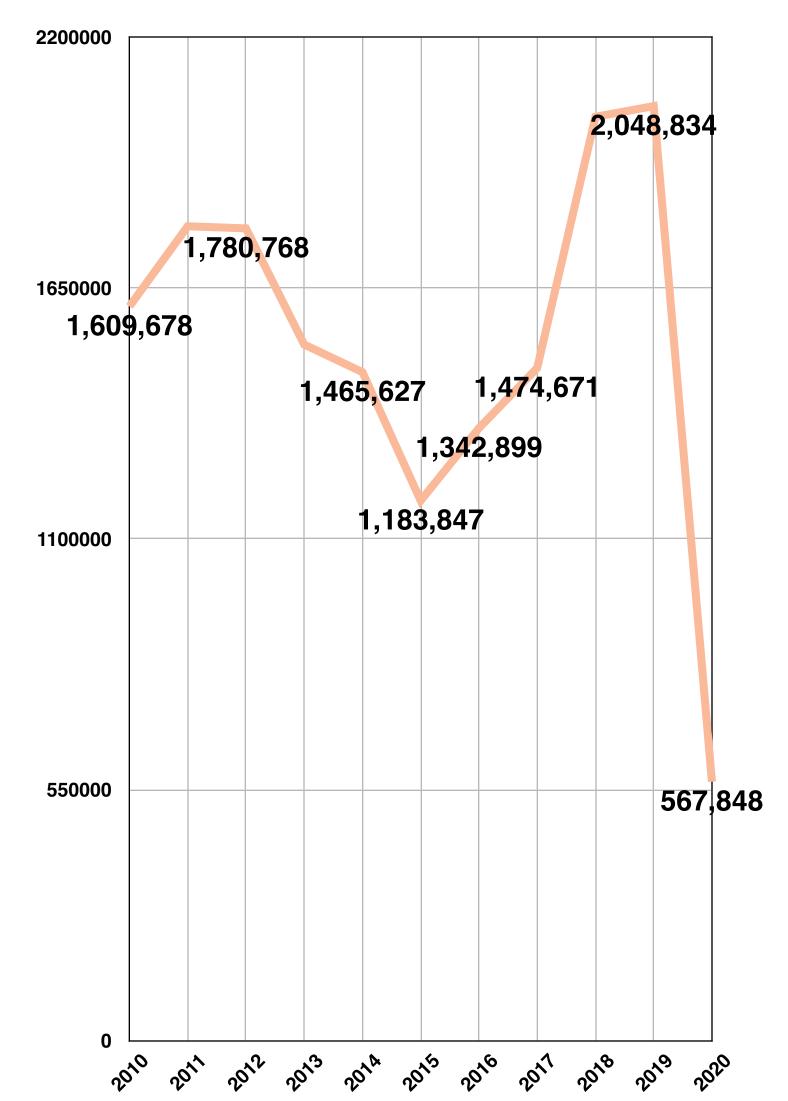












International Arrivals

For the destination Kenya, international arrivals from January to December 2020 closed at 567,848 which is a reduction of 72.3% when compared to 2019 performance when arrivals closed at 2,048,834. The table below gives a synopsis of the performance over the last 10 years.

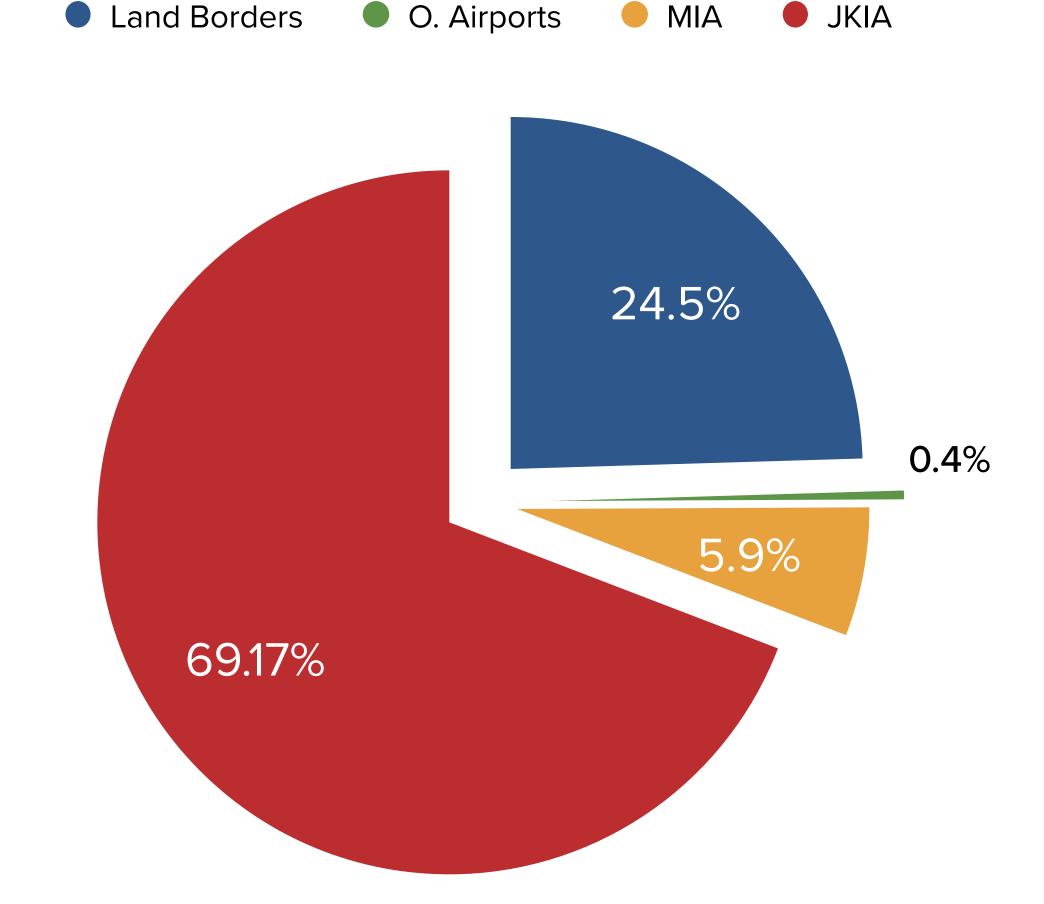




Arrivals by Points of Entry

The arrivals by entry points are as here below:

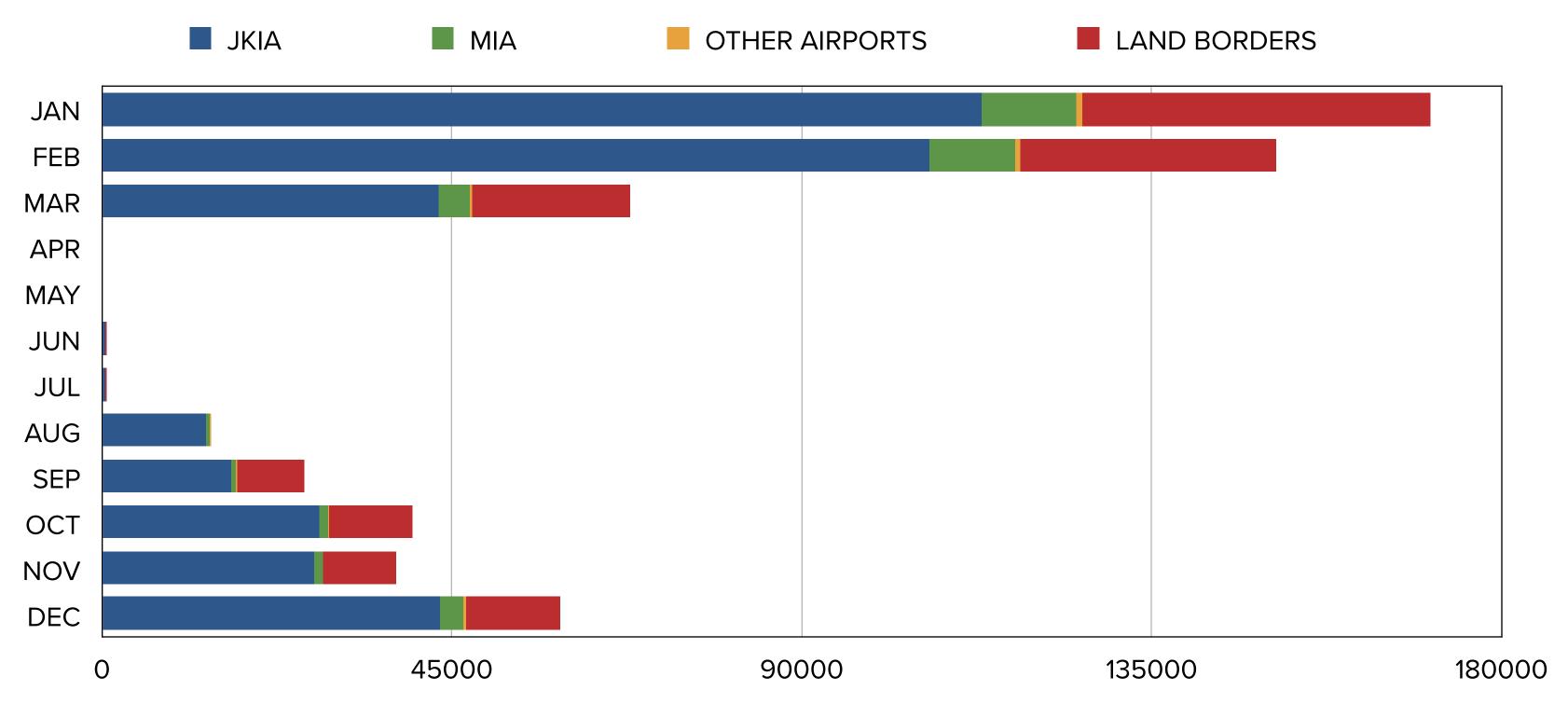
- JKIA arrivals closed at 392,363 in 2020 from 1,423,971 in 2019 representing a decline of -72.4%
- MIAM arrivals for the period closed at 33,785 in 2020 from 128,222 in 2019, a decline of -73.7%
- Other airports for the period closed at 2,465 down from 29,462 in 2019. This is a decline of -91.6%
- Land borders arrivals closed at 139,692 in 2020 down from 467,180 in 2019 indicating a decline of -70.1%.





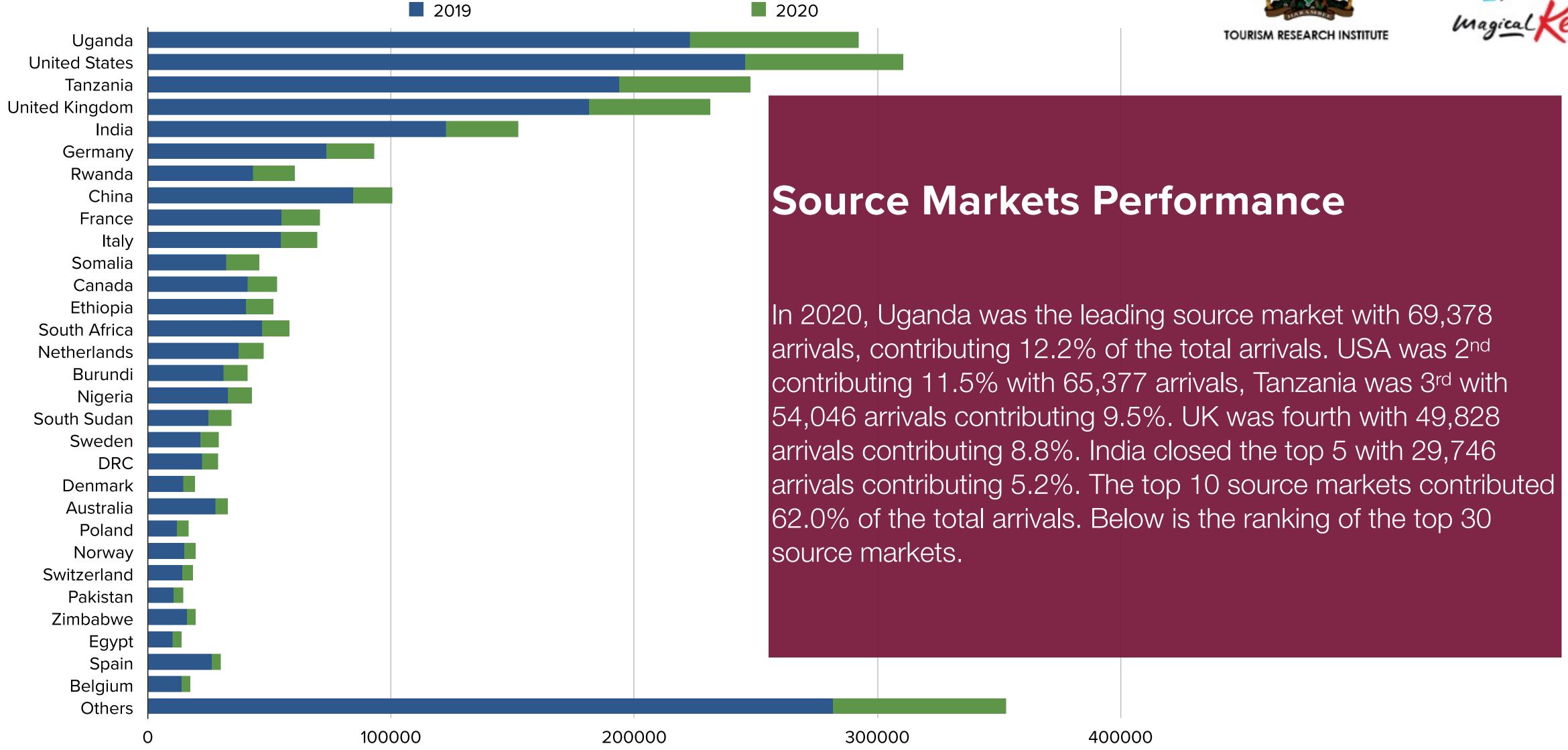

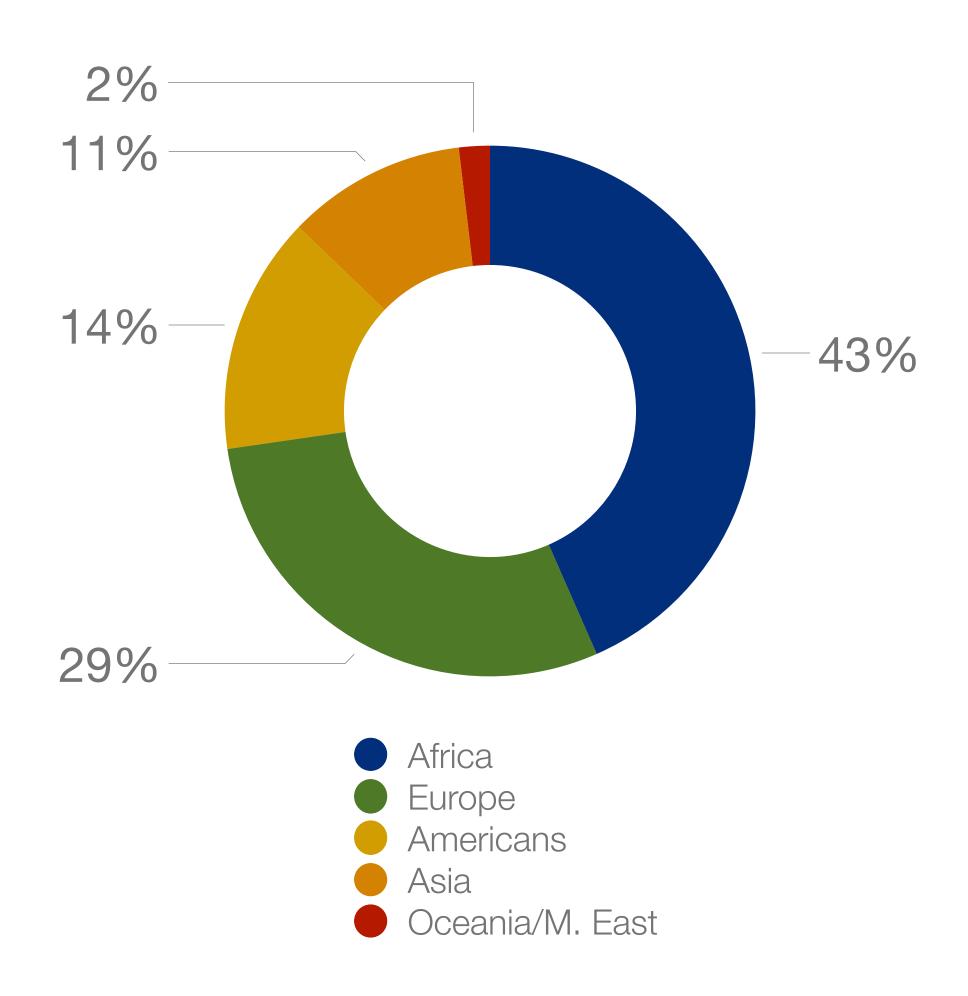

In terms of regional performance, Africa contributed the highest arrivals at 43.4% closing at 246,505 visitors, Europe was 2nd with 166,386 visitors translating to 29.3% of the total arrivals, Americas was 3rd with 82,199 visitors, 14.5%. Asia was 4th with 62,050 visitors at 10.9%, Oceania and Middle East contributed 1.8% closing at 10,708 arrivals.





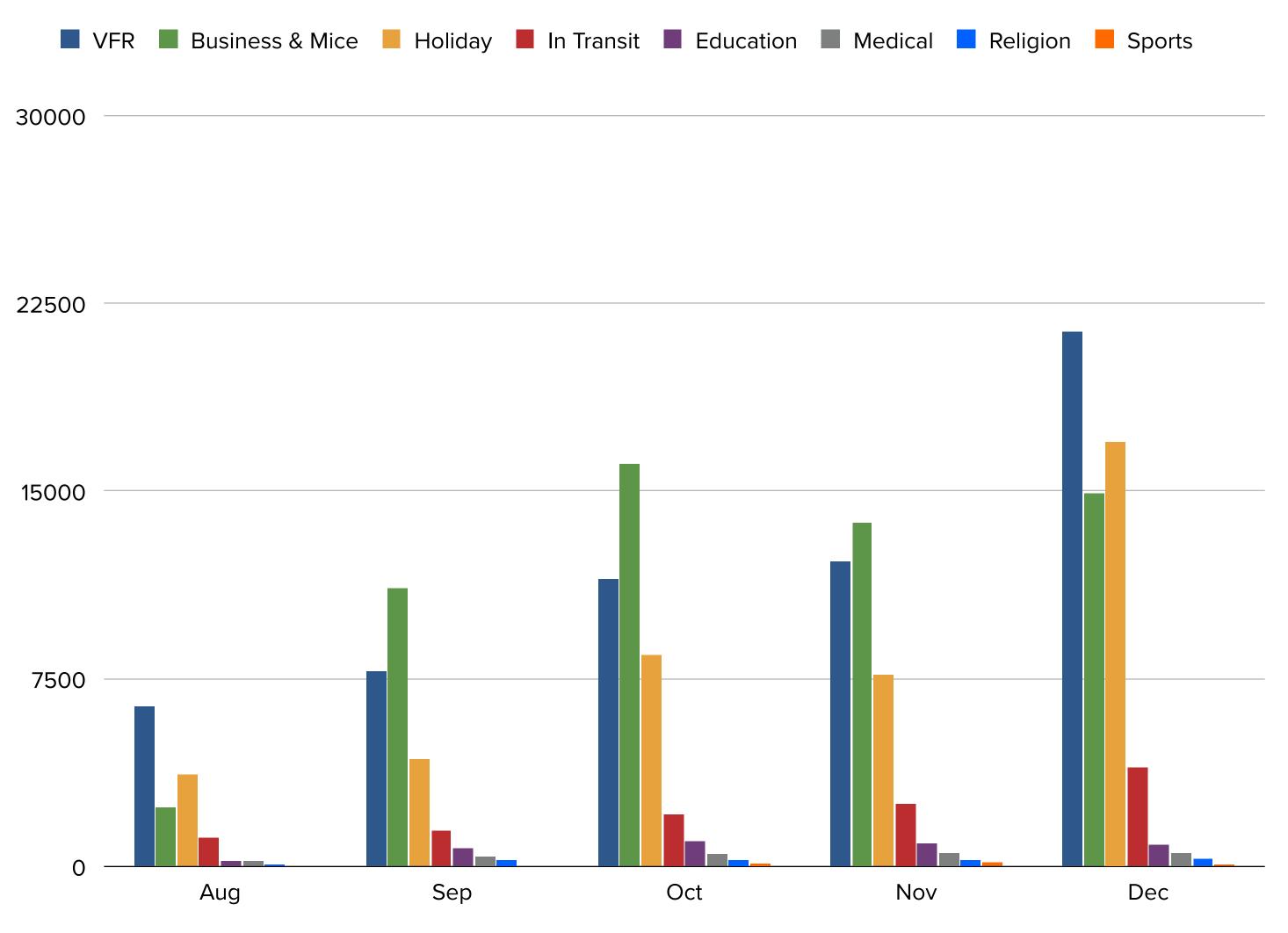






Purpose of Visit

Data on purpose of travel for international tourism is available from August 2020 supported by an improvement in the system of collecting arrivals data. Since August (after the re-opening of Kenya's airspace for nonessential travel) visiting friends and relatives contributed 33.4% of the total arrivals closing at 59,151. Business and MICE was 2nd contributing 32.9% with 58,163. Holiday was 3rd contributing 23.2% with 41,054 arrivals. On Transit passengers came in 4th contributing 6.3% closing with 11,069 and others purposes of entry which include education, medical, religious and sports contributed: 5.8% closing at 10,389 arrivals.

Tourism Earnings – Receipts from International Tourism

Total receipts from international tourism for the period are estimated to have closed at kshs. 88.567 billion. This is against projected earnings of kshs. 336.228 billion if Covid-19 did not strike translating to a 73.66% loss.

The development of Kenya TSA has enabled an improvement on the methodology for calculating receipts from international tourists that nets all relevant expenditures.

Domestic Tourism Performance

Domestic tourism bed nights closed at 1,845,500. This is a reduction of 61.7% when compared to 2019 performance of 4,818,600



Global Travel and Tourism Trends

According to Oxford Economics Global travel demand fell by an estimated 73% in 2020 – a loss of 1.1bn visitor arrivals. Recovery is set to begin in 2021, driven by the following key factors:

- Vaccine development and roll-out will support growth and provide an upside for 2021. Recent vaccine announcements have revitalized confidence and provide a more balanced risk outlook compared to previous forecasts. This has sparked hope for future travel performance with clear upside potential, although downside risks remain.
- •Challenges in vaccine distribution will define the recovery profile in 2021. Vaccine developments have reduced the downside risks and will allow a gradual lifting of restrictions. However, many unknowns remain regarding vaccine production and the challenges involved in the global distribution, especially in emerging markets.
- •Economic income and job impacts will reduce affordability. There is clear and significant pent-up demand, but this will be limited by lingering wage and employment effects of the economic recession, especially for more expensive longer-haul travel. Pricing is less certain but may also affect affordability.
- *Travelers will choose closer-to-home destinations. Domestic substitution will continue in 2021 as some international travel restrictions will remain in place for at least part of the year. It will take time for traveler sentiment to recover and short-haul markets will be favored due to safety perception, affordability and possible shifts in preferences for more sustainable destinations and travel modes. Modal shift from air to drive travel will remain a feature in 2021.
- •Virtual and hybrid events will continue to replace some in-person meetings and events, but the value of face-to-face meetings will ensure eventual recovery.





Projected Trends for Destination Kenya

From projections, inbound arrivals into Africa is forecasted to increase on a gradual momentum reaching the 2019 performance level in 2024 as indicated in the table below

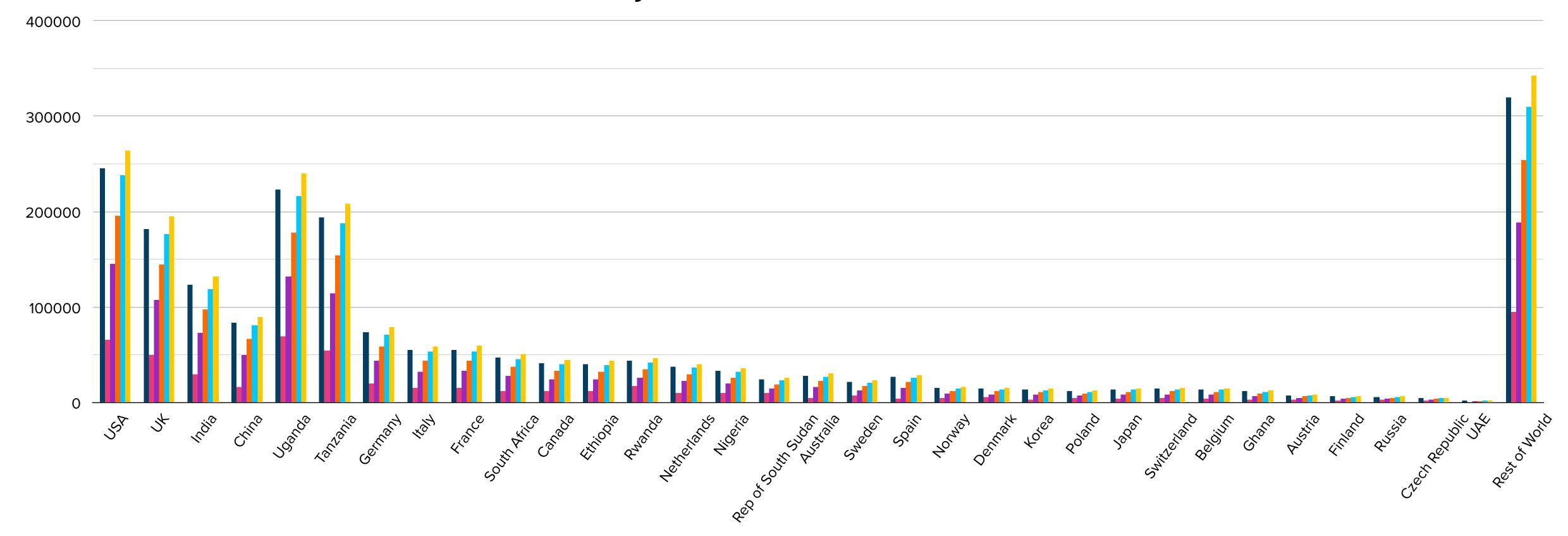
